

On January 13th 1983 the Confraternity of Saint James came into being when seven people, brought together through Mademoiselle Warcollier of the Société des Amis de St. Jacques de Compostelle, decided to try to found a national society devoted to the pilgrimage to Santiago. So now with 280 members in Great Britain, Ireland, and six other countries, we celebrate our fifth birthday with a post-AGM party. Newer members will be particularly welcome. Food and wine, a book stall, raffle and informal reunion of 1987 Santiago visit participants (with photographs) are part of the evening. Copies of Edwin Mullins' book The Pilgrimage to Santiago (£6) and Brian and Marcus Tate's The Pilgrim Route to Santiago (£25) will both be available.

Catering Arrangements - there is a charge of £3 for the party (£1-50 for children aged 8 to 14, under 8s free) which includes fruit juice. Wine will be available separately. Alternatively, to help with catering, members may choose to pay £1-50 and bring food to the value of around £1-50. This is a great help to committee members who have to cater for up to 75 people.
