

## Tilford Bach Society Saturday 2nd May 1998 at 8pm in Farnham Castle

Katherine Sharman was born in New Zealand where she studied modern and baroque cello. She has now settled in England where she performs regularly as a soloist, chamber musician and continuo player. She was soloist in the TBS Festival 1996 for the first modern performance of John Garth's cello concerto no 3. She has made several recordings of chamber music, she plays continuo cello with many leading period-instrument orchestras, and she plays the jazz bass guitar. Her interest in improvisation, combined with her research into historical performance techniques, have led her to specialise in the embellishment of continuo parts on the baroque cello.

Gail Hennessy was born in Wisconsin, USA. She studied modern oboe in Louisville, Kentucky, and Historical Performance Practice at Washington University before coming to Britain in 1983 to study baroque oboe with the late David Reichenberg at the GSMD. She has played with most of Britain's major early music groups, and is a regular member of the Hanover Band, the Parley of Instruments, Opera Restor'd and St James' Baroque Players. Gail has broadcast as a soloist on BBC Radio 3 many times. Solos on disc include a Vivaldi trio sonata with Paul Goodwin.

They will play the Sonata in C major BWV 1033 attributed to JS Bach; Gabrielli's Ricecare no 2 in A minor for solo cello; Matthew Locke's Suite in E minor; Bach's cello suite no 2 in D minor and Handel's sonata in F major.

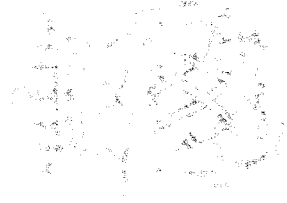

Stefanie Heichelheim has proved herself an instinctive singer, having sung since she was a child. When she sang to Lyndon van der Pump, head of vocal studies at the Royal College of Music, she was immediately encouraged to study singing. She gave her first solo recital in June 1996. Already well known as a viola player with many leading orchestras and chamber ensembles, Stefanie has participated in chamber recitals as a soloist and sang the role of Mary Magdalene in Handel's oratorio *La Resurrezione*.

Paul Nicholson is already well known as a solo harpsichord player, continuo player and director of baroque music groups. He has recently recorded Handel's 12 organ concertos for Hyperion with Roy Goodman and the Brandenburg Consort, giving a dazzling performance on an instrument played by Handel himself. At the end of 1997 Paul provided the piano solo and chamber-music soundtrack for a Channel 4 drama documentary on Schubert. He has suggested providing a similar programme of piano and vocal music at Farnham Castle.

The Cambridge Tavener Choir is one of the leading English choirs specialising in the music of the Renaissance. Its members were trained in the English choral tradition as choral scholars at Cambridge. They specialise in 16th and early 17th century music of Portugal, Spain, Italy and England. They perform an annual season of concerts in the chapel of Jesus College Cambridge, and have released 3 highly acclaimed CDs, one of which is shortlisted for the prestigious Gramophone Early Music award. The choir has sung in festivals throughout Europe and the UK, and performs on BBC Radio.

Owen Rees, who is both scholar and performer, has directed the choir over its 11 years. He has brought to concert halls and recording studios substantial repertoires of magnificent and previously unknown music from Renaissance Portugal, and has conducted and broadcast throughout Europe. He is now Fellow and Praelector in music at Queen's College Oxford and lecturer in the University's music faculty.

Supported by awards from the Countess of Munster Musical Trust, and the Martin and Fleming Trusts, Maria Cooper graduated in 1995 from the Royal Northern College of Music with a G. Mus., followed in 1996 with the Postgraduate and Professional Performance Diploma. Whilst at the RNCM she won prizes for Paganini and chamber music, and performed the Mendelssohn and Brahms double concertos. In 1994 she was a string finalist in the Royal Over-Seas League Competition and runner-up in the ISM Violin Competition in Sheffield. Subsequently she gave recitals at St James's Piccadilly and St Martin-in-the-Fields, and participated as leader of an RNCM ensemble at the UK-LA Festival in Los Angeles, performing programmes of Music Theatre and contemporary British opera. Maria's wide chamber music experience stems from regular attendance at Pro Corda, and includes coaching with the Allegri, Amadeus and Vermeer Quartets. Whilst a pupil of Yossi Zivoni from 1990 to 1996 she recorded the Bartok duos with him (Meridian) and the Dvorak quintet with Clementi (ASV). She also appeared on the BBC Radio 3 Young Artists Forum series and on Hong Kong Radio 4. Her programme will include works by Bach and Mozart.
